

From Beta to VHS, from DVD to Blu Ray, SIGLFF has been proud to bring the best in LGBTQ storytelling to


Sacramento since 1992. Stories of love and loss, of people affected by HIV/AIDS, injustice, racism, sexism, and acts of violence. We believe film played a role in galvanizing the modern LGBTQ movement, by sharing the human side of our struggle and even more importantly, our triumphs and victories.

When we first began, gay men, lesbians, and transgender people could not marry, adopt,

nor serve openly in the military. We faced housing and employee discrimination without recourse, acts of violence not recognized as hate crimes. We were unable to legally identify by our chosen gender.

This year's program pays homage to the soldiers, fighters, and revolutionaries who helped to secure adoption rights, marital rights, and so much more.

As 2016 is a presidential election year, our opening night film, *Political Animals*, is particularly relevant. The film examines the careers and amazing civil rights work of four women who have made a difference in the lives of all LGBTQ Californians. Keeping the theme of making a difference, we are honored to present a film recognizing the work of Miss Major, a Black transgender elder and activist who has been fighting for the rights of Trans women of color for over 40 years.





Political Animals tells the story of the civil rights struggle of this century—the LGBT rights movement—through the eyes of four elected women, a group often left out of gay histories until now. Emotionally charged like its subjects, the film follows four groundbreaking lesbians who took the fight for the causes most personal to them and their communities off the streets and into the halls of government. Fierce, determined, focused and passionate, these women had the courage and foresight to start the work of legal rights of the LGBT community, ultimately paving the way for other states across the nation.

Legends of Courage Project - Camille Wojtasiak on Being Gay in Business


Director Dawn Deason, 2016 USA 2 min.

Director André Téchiné, 2016 France 109 min. French with English subtitles

Director André Téchiné (*Wild Reeds*) returns with a new masterwork about gay adolescence, with a talented cast delivering delicately nuanced performances. Thomas and Damien, high school classmates in the remote French Pyrenees find that increased testosterone and unspoken feelings have created a complex rivalry they find difficult to understand, leading to occasional outbursts of violence as their lives become increasingly entwined.

Alzheimer's: A Love Story

Directors Monica Petruzzelli & Gabe Schimmel, 2016 USA 17 min.

Those diagnosed with Alzheimer's live an average of eight years after their symptoms first become noticeable—it's been 12 years for Greg. He lives at a memory care facility in Chicago and can no longer live independently. Every day a man named Michael comes and visits for a couple of hours. No one can say for sure if Greg knows who Michael is or why he comes every day, but it seems he does. From Michael's point of view it's only natural that Greg appears to know him—after all, Michael has loved Greg since the day they met 40 years ago.

Teenage lust, woozy visions, and a talking hamster voiced by Isabella Rossellini shape this queer coming-of-age tale that's as strange, scary, and sublime as the real experience. Winner of multiple awards on the festival circuit and directed by Stephen Dunn, whose sexually irreverent short *Pop-Up Porno* was a favorite among SIGLFF audiences last year, *Closet Monster* is an impressive first feature that verifies Dunn's reputation as a risk-taking visionary. *Closet Monster* is deliriously dark, but with a cheeky comic wit that emerges via Oscar's closest confidante: "Buffy," the wryly observant rodent.

Laurie McBride discusses how the AIDS crisis was instrumental in the LGBT struggle for civil rights. She is an important advocate for LGBT civil rights and has been for most of her life. She served as the Assistant Secretary of State for California and Chief of Staff for the Majority Leader in the California Assembly. Laurie was at ground zero in San Francisco during the most frightening days of the AIDS crisis.

Challenging stereotypes of gender, sexuality, and race, three Asian American women share their experiences, frustrations, and identity amid the backdrop of San Francisco's Castro District and other neighborhoods.

Libertad is a short documentary featuring the incredible Alejandra Santiago, an indigenous transwoman from Oaxaca whose life journey transcends multiple borders.




