Sacramento International LGBTQ Film Festival Celebrates 26th Year Bringing Some of the Best of 2017 Queer Film to the Crest Theater

SACRAMENTO, CA -- Celebrating its 26th anniversary, the Sacramento International LGBTQ Film Festival (produced by SIGLFF) is a spectacular community event consisting of three days of LGBTQ film, local food, beer, wine, and live entertainment!

Join us as we take over the historic Crest Theater in downtown Sacramento, CA, for 3-days: Friday, Saturday, Sunday, October 13, 14, 15, 2017 for some of the best queer cinema of 2017. Eight programs comprised of six feature-length films and 16 short films will be showcased.

While our organization name remains the same (SIGLFF), we have updated our *Festival* name to Sacramento International *LGBTQ* Film Festival to better reflect who we are as a community and as audiences for queer film.

SIGLFF26 features three fabulous feature films: We open this year with *Alaska Is a Drag*, writer-director Shaz Bennett has expanded her short film into a rousing and crowd-pleasing debut feature that is the queer lovechild of Rocky and Hedwig. Director Shaz Bennett will be in attendance at Opening Night for a post-screening Q&A.

On Saturday, October 14: *Signature Move* directed by Jennifer Reeder and starring the sexy and talented Fawzia Mirza plays on Saturday night, with local Sacramento comedienne Elisia Gonzales starting off with a short stand-up set for an evening of comedy. *After Louie*, an engaging inter-generational story starring Alan Cumming, Zachary Booth, Wilson Cruz and with Mx. Justin Vivian Bond.

SIGLFF26 has three riveting documentaries: *The Untold Tales of Armistead Maupin* which examines the amazing life of the celebrated San Francisco wordsmith, directed by Jennifer Kroot and editor extraordinaire Bill Weber (the team behind *To Be Takei*).

The Death and Life of Marsha P. Johnson which looks at the life and mysterious death of this transgender pioneer and her dear friend Sylvia Rivera in this riveting film.

SIGLFF26's Closing Night Film, *The Lavender Scare*, tells the McCarthy-era story of an unrelenting campaign by the federal government to identify and fire all employees suspected of being homosexual. Director Josh Howard will be in attendance at the screening.

Jen Hatton, SIGLFF Board Member and Programmer says "For 26 years SIGLFF has brought quality films that explore the LGBTQ culture. This year is no different, from comedies and documentaries to



character-driven dramas, SIGLFF continues to enrich the Sacramento Valley with films that both inform and inspire. It's a wonderful community building event that everyone I know looks forward to year after year."

Who killed Marsha P. Johnson? When the beloved, self-described "street queen" of NY's Christopher Street was found floating in the Hudson River in 1992, the NYPD called her death a suicide. Protests erupted but the police remained impassive and refused to investigate. Now, twenty-five years on, Academy Award® nominated director and journalist David France (*How to Survive a Plague*) examines Marsha's death—and her extraordinary life— thanks to the work of a dynamic activist named Victoria Cruz.

Marsha teamed up with Sylvia Rivera, the radical duo fought arrests, condemned police brutality, organized street kids, battled the intolerant majority within the gay community, and helped spearhead the Stonewall Riots. In 1970 they formed the world's first trans-rights organization, STAR (Street Transvestites Action Revolutionaries). Marsha and Sylvia ignited a powerful and lasting civil rights movement for gender nonconforming people. (Last year we screened S.T.A.R., a documentary short about Marsha and Sylvia)

Marsha arrived in the Village in the 1960s where she teamed up with Sylvia Rivera when both claimed their identities as "Drag Queens," to use the vernacular of the times. Together, the radical duo fought arrests, condemned police brutality, organized street kids, battled the intolerant majority within the gay community, and helped spearhead the Stonewall Riots.

In 1970 they formed the world's first trans-rights organization, STAR (Street Transvestites Action Revolutionaries). Despite their many challenges over the years—bias, homelessness, illness—Marsha and Sylvia ignited a powerful and lasting civil rights movement for gender nonconforming people.

Now, a quarter century later, at a time of unprecedented visibility and escalating violence in the transgender community, a dynamic activist named Victoria Cruz has taken it upon herself to reexamine what happened at the end of Marsha's Life. THE DEATH AND LIFE OF MARSHA P. JOHNSON follows as this champion pursues leads, mobilizes officials, and works to get to the bottom of Marsha's death.

THE UNTOLD TALES OF ARMISTEAD MAUPIN examines the life and work of one of the world's most beloved storytellers, following his evolution from a conservative son of the Old South into a gay rights pioneer whose novels have inspired millions to claim their own truth. Jennifer Kroot's documentary about the creator of Tales Of The City moves nimbly between playful and poignant and laugh-out-loud



funny. With help from his friends (including Neil Gaiman, Laura Linney, Olympia Dukakis, Sir Ian McKellen and Amy Tan), Maupin offers a disarmingly frank look at the journey that took him from the jungles of Vietnam to the bathhouses of '70s San Francisco to the front line of the American culture war.

Sacramento-based comedian, Elisia Gonzales will kick off the program with a short stand-up set!

SIGNATURE MOVE is a comedic and heartfelt look at modern families and the complexities of love in its many forms. Zaynab (Fawzia Mirza) is a Pakistani, Muslim lawyer living in Chicago who begins a new romance with Alma (Sari Sanchez), a confident Mexican-American woman. Zaynab's recently widowed mother Parveen (Shabana Azmi) has moved in and spends her days watching Pakistani TV dramas while searching for a potential husband for her only daughter. Alma's mother is a former professional Luchadora, which Zaynab finds fascinating, as she has recently taken up lucha-style wrestling with a former pro wrestler. Zaynab tries to keep her secrets from her mother, who knows more than she lets on. (SIGLFF audiences will remember Fawzia in last year's short SPUNKLE, and her raucous Q&A after feature film *Jamie and Jess are Not Together* in SIGLFF20.)

AFTER LOUIE follows Sam (Alan Cumming), an artist and activist from ACT UP who lived through the early years of HIV/AIDS—a man scarred and still struggling with survivor's guilt. Cemented into an oppressive past, he is bewildered by a younger generation of carefree gay men with their uninhibited use of social media, sexting, and seeming political indifference. But when he meets the seductive young Braeden (Zachary Booth) at a bar late one night, their pants quickly come down and, eventually, so does Sam's ossified guard. As the pair become increasingly intimate, an intergenerational relationship blossoms between them-one capable of reawakening Sam's artistic soul and reviving his wilted heart.

The Lavender Scare is the first documentary film to tell the little-known story of an unrelenting campaign by the federal government to identify and fire all employees suspected of being homosexual. In 1953, President Eisenhower declared gay men and lesbians to be a threat to the security of the country and therefore unfit for government service.

In doing so, he triggered the longest witch hunt in American history. The Lavender Scare is a compelling



story of one man's fight for justice. And it is a chilling reminder of how easy it can be, during a time of fear and uncertainty, to trample the rights of an entire class of people in the name of patriotism and national security.
